Online Learning Rules

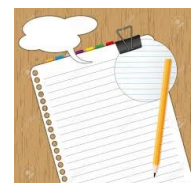
- **Location**, find a quiet place downstairs to set up online, NOT in a bedroom.
- **Dress code**, please don't wear your pyjamas or logo t-shirts that you wouldn't be able wear to school. Make sure your family are doing the same.
- **Polite language**, same rules apply as if you are in class, NO swearing, NO personal remarks about other students, NO bullying.
- **Background**, think about what others can see behind you, it might cause others upset. Explore changing your background.

E-Safety Rules

STOP and think – am I following the E-Safety Rules?

I will only use the Internet and computing equipment with an adult's permission and I will use it carefully.

I will keep my login and password information secret.

I will not send my phone number, address or a photo of me to anybody.

I will only use activities that an adult has allowed me to use and I will ask for help if I am not sure what to do.

If I see something that makes me feel unhappy I will tell an adult.
